Following the opening ceremony of the Heritage Celebration, we will head on a special river expedition to the Sun Koshi.

The Sun Koshi Expedition is a classic and popular journey among adventurer. Ideal for intermediate paddlers, it offers exciting Class III+ rapids set amid stunning scenery —lush forests, terraced hillsides, cascading waterfalls, traditional villages, and wide sandy beaches. This 280 km river journey is full of adventure, wilderness, and unforgettable Himalayan river experiences.

After experiencing the scenic beauty and formidable challenge of the Sun Koshi's and completing the expedition, we will return to Kathmandu, where the celebration will conclude with the closing ceremony & Reception.

17- Nov- Drive to the River

We depart Kathmandu by private vehicle,
travelling north east to Dolalghat, the starting
point of our journey. Here we prepare
equipment, receive a safety briefing, and begin
our paddle on the Sun Koshi.

18- 24 Nov -The Heart of the Sun Koshi

Over the next seven days, first couple of days
easy paddling ,we journey through one of the
world's great river corridors, covering
approximately 280 km of whitewater and
scenery. Each day brings a new rhythm, passing
small villages, experience indigenous culture
scouting and running rapids, swimming beneath
waterfalls, and drifting through peaceful
canyons. Evenings are spent camping on the
white-sandy beaches, sharing stories by the
campfire under the stars.

Highlights include the big rapids of Harkapur,
the waters of the Dugh Koshi (The river from
Everest) and classic sections such as Jaws,
Rhino Rock Jungle corridor and Big Dipper. The
final night we spent near the confluence of
Arun & Tamur river.

25 Nov – Take out & flight to Kathmandu

A relaxed final float, passing ancient Hindu
temples Baraha Chhetra , After taking out at
Chatara, packing equipment, thanking our
crew, two hour drive to Biratnagar to catch
flight to Kathmandu.

26- Nov - Leisure Day in Kathmandu

The day is free for rest ,shopping or
sightseeing.

27- Nov Closing Ceremony & Reception

In the evening ceremony, we will conclude
this adventure with a closing event and
Nagarik Abinandan for our expedition
guests.

28- Nov – Departure

Transfer to the airport for onward travel.
