



THE RIVER OF EVEREST DUDH KOSHI EXPEDITION

Following the opening ceremony of the Heritage Celebration, we will head on a special river expedition to the Dudh Koshi.

Dudh Koshi River stands as one of Nepal's rarely paddled rivers. Its remote access & powerful white water have kept this river wild, challenging, and largely untouched. This expedition offers experienced paddlers a rare opportunity to explore the lower section of Dudh Koshi, continuing downstream into the Sun Koshi River. This raft and kayak supported journey delivers an exceptional multi-day paddling experience.

After experiencing the thrilling splash & breathtaking scenery of Dudh Koshi and completing the expedition, we will return to Kathmandu, where the celebration will conclude with the closing ceremony & Reception.

13- Nov– Travel to The Royal Beach Camp

16- 17 Nov- Overland Journey to the River

The overland journey begins to Rabuwa Khola, the put-in point. Travel through remote terrain, setting the tone for a true expedition style overlanding.

18- 20 Nov-Dudh Koshi

Launching onto the lower Dudh Koshi, paddling Class II, III water in a remote landscapes. Continue downstream to the confluence with the Sun Koshi, camping at the Little Rajasthan Beach.

21 Nov - Jaws & Dead Man's Eddy

Early start to run the famous Jaws and Dead Man's Eddy section of the rapids. The afternoon features a series of exciting class III rapids before making camp above Rhino Rock.

22 Nov - Rhino Rock & Jungle Corridor

A game day on the river. Run Rhino Rock and the powerful white water of the Jungle Corridor. Lunch at Waterfall Beach, followed by a relaxed afternoon paddle to Sunshine Camp.

23 Nov - Rest Day at Sunshine Camp

A well earned rest day to relax, swim, explore, or enjoy optional short kayaking sessions for interested rafters at Sunshine Camp.

24 Nov - Classic Sun Koshi River

Early start and paddle through scenic section of Sun Koshi, enjoying big-volume water and long wave trains. Camp below Big deeper near the Arun and Tamur confluence.

25 Nov - Take-Out & Flight to Kathmandu

Final paddle to the take-out at Chatara. During the paddle, stay away from the motor boat! At the take out, Pack equipment and transfer to Biratnagar, followed by an afternoon flight to Kathmandu.

26- Nov - Leisure Day in Kathmandu

The day is free for rest ,shopping or sightseeing.

27- Nov Closing Ceremony & Reception

In the evening ceremony, we will conclude this adventure with a closing event and Nagarik Abinandan for our expedition guests.

28- Nov – Departure

Transfer to the airport for onward travel.
